

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE 1963 EDITION OF THE STANDARDS OF SAFETY AND ORDERING AND DIRECTING THE ENFORCEMENT THEREOF.

SECTION I.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MORGANFIELD, KENTUCKY, that the 1963 Edition of the STANDARDS OF SAFETY, made and adopted by the Commissioner of Public Safety of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, a copy of which is on file in the office of the City Clerk of Morganfield, Kentucky, is hereby adopted in full as an ordinance of this City as if written in length in words and figures.

IT IS FURTHER ORDAINED THAT A copy of this ordinance be sent to said Division of Fire Prevention of the Department of Public Safety, Commonwealth of Kentucky.

SECTION II.

That the Chief of the Fire Department of Morganfield along with all other officers, agents, and employees of the City of Morganfield, Kentucky, be and they are hereby charged with the enforcement of the provisions of the said STANDARDS OF SAFETY.

SECTION III.

Penalty for Violations. Any person who violates any provision of KRS 227.200 to KRS 227.400 or any provision of a lawful order, rule or regulation made under the provisions of KRS 227.200 to KRS 227.400, or induces another to violate any provisions of KRS 227.200 to KRS 227.400 or of any lawful order, rule or regulation made thereunder, shall be fined not less than ten dollars nor more than five hundred dollars, or confined in the county jail for not more than sixty days, or both. Each day such violations exist shall, in the discretion of the courts, be considered a separate offense.

The imposition of the penalties herein prescribed shall not preclude the city from instituting an appropriate action of proceeding to prevent an unlawful erection, construction, reconstruction alteration, repair, conversion, maintenance or use, or to restrain, correct or abate a violation, or to prevent the occupancy of a building, structure or premises or to prevent an illegal act, conduct, business or use in or about any premises.

SECTION IV.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflicts, hereby repealed.

SECTION V.

This ordinance shall be effective immediately after its acceptance, approval and publication as required by law.

- (32) Alley from E. Waverly to E. Offutt Street.

Said streets and public ways shall be oiled as needed during the calendar year 1963, and the cost thereof to be charged to abutting property owners accordingly, to become a part of their property tax bill when taxes are due September, 1963.

RESOLUTION

On modification of Uniontown Locks and Dam to support a future bridge.

WHEREAS, the Army Corps of Engineers has recently announced the location of the proposed Uniontown Dam in the Ohio River between Posey County, Indiana and Union County, Kentucky, and,

WHEREAS, the best interests of the State of Indiana and of the Commonwealth of Kentucky in this area requires that the Dam be modified so as to support a future bridge, and,

WHEREAS, the initial expense to the State for the Locks and Dam modification would, through cooperation with the Kentucky Highway Department, be a modest one and this modification would save a major part of the cost if and when a bridge is constructed at this site, and,

WHEREAS, this bridge would provide access to the South and Southwest and to the North and Northeast of all industries on both sides of the River in the Tri-States in addition to the area already mentioned, and,

WHEREAS, the said modification for a bridge would open up a whole new labor area for the benefit of the whole Tri-State, and,

WHEREAS, the said bridge would provide a transportation route between the States and help industry, and,

WHEREAS, the said bridge would provide an alternate route North and South in case the bridge on US 41 South of Evansville was temporarily unusable because of the National Emergency, or as in the case of the 1937 flood, the approach to the bridge on US 41 was washed out.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MORGANFIELD, KENTUCKY, That the Army Corps of Engineers be urged to modify the Uniontown Locks and Dam to support a future bridge.

WHEREAS, notice of sale of \$325,000 City of Morganfield Natural Gas Distribution System Revenue Refunding Bonds, dated May 1, 1963, has heretofore been given in strict compliance with law and an ordinance of the City Council by publication in the Union County Advocate, the newspaper published in the City of Morganfield, Kentucky, in the Courier-Journal, published in Louisville, Kentucky, and of general circulation in Kentucky and in the City of Morganfield, Kentucky, and in the Bond Buyer, New York, New York, which publications are hereby authorized, ratified and approved, and

WHEREAS, the Clerk of the City of Morganfield and Stein Bros. & Boyce, Inc., the Fiscal Agent for the City, have furnished prospective bidders inquiring for same Further Information as to Sale of Bonds and Bid Forms with reference to such sale, the forms of which are hereby authorized, ratified and approved, and

WHEREAS, the matter of which bid is most advantageous to the City of Morganfield, Kentucky, has been sufficiently considered,

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF MORGANFIELD, KENTUCKY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the bid of Equitable Securities of Nashville, Tennessee and W.L. Lyons & Co., of Louisville, Kentucky, for the sale of said \$325,000 of City of Morganfield Natural Gas Distribution System Revenue, Refunding Bonds, dated May 1, 1963, be accepted and confirmed, the said bid being at the price of \$325,000.00 for \$325,000 principal amount of bonds, plus accrued interest from May 1, 1963 to bear interest at the rate (s) of

and the said bid being hereby determined to be the highest and best bid to the City for said bonds, and the interest rate (s) on said bonds shall be fixed by a separate ordinance as set out in said successful bid.

2. That said bonds numbered 1 through 325 shall be delivered by the City Treasurer and/or other proper City officials to said purchaser as soon as ready, in accordance with the ordinance authorizing such bonds, and the proceeds of all of said bonds, shall be used only as provided in said ordinance.

3. That the confirmation of this bid subjects the City to no liability if for any reason it is unable to obtain the final approving legal opinion of Skaggs, Hays & Fahey, Attorneys, Louisville, Kentucky, or if said bonds or the interest thereon should be subject to ad valorem or income taxation by the Federal Government, Kentucky, or any political subdivision of Kentucky prior to the delivery of said bonds, but the purchaser shall not be required to accept delivery of said bonds without the final approving opinion of said attorneys accompanying said bonds or if such bonds or the interest thereon should become so subject to taxation.

4. That all motions, resolutions or ordinances or parts thereof in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
