

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO TRAFFIC AND REGULATION OF THE USE OF PUBLIC STREETS AND HIGHWAYS OF THE CITY OF MORGANFIELD, KENTUCKY, PROVIDING FOR THE INSTALLATION, REGULATION, & CONTROL OF THE USE OF PARKING METERS AND PARKING METER ZONES: AUTHORIZING A METHOD OF PAYMENT FOR PARKING METERS AND THE INSTALLATION EXCLUSIVELY FROM THE RECEIPTS OBTAINED FROM THEIR OPERATIONS PROVIDING FOR THE ENFORCEMENT AND PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF, AND PROVIDING THAT INVALIDITY OF PARTS SHALL NOT AFFECT THE VALIDITY OF THE REMAINDER OF THIS ORDINANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MORGANFIELD, KENTUCKY AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I. The Word "vehicle" as used herein shall mean any device by which any person or property may be transportable on the highway, except those operated upon rails or tracks.

SECTION II. The Words "Street Committee" shall be the committee of the City Council of the City of Morganfield designated by the Mayor as the Street Committee.

SECTION III. The Street Committee of the City of Morganfield is delegated the right and duty of the City Council of establishing Parking and No Parking Areas to establish reasonable traffic control. Parking areas shall be enclosed by a white line or white marking, No Parking areas shall be shown by the painting of yellow lines along the street and/or curb. Parking in No Parking Areas shall constitute a violation of this ordinance.

SECTION IV. Double Parking shall constitute a violation of this ordinance.

SECTION V. The Street Committee shall designate the places in the City of Morganfield, Kentucky, where parking meters shall be installed.

SECTION VI. The Street Committee of the City of Morganfield, Kentucky, shall have the power and authority to designate one way streets and violation of the rules of travel on one way streets, as indicated by signs, shall constitute a violation of this ordinance.

SECTION VII. The Street Committee shall provide for installation of meters, including curb or street marking lines, regulations and operation thereof, and shall cause said meters to be maintained in good workable order. Meters shall be placed upon the curb in appropriate places. Individual parking places and meters shall be so constructed as to display a signal showing legal parking upon deposit therein of the proper coin, or coins, of the United States as indicated in instruction on said meter and for the period as set out on the meter conforming to the parking limits of the City of Morganfield, Kentucky, said signal to remain in evidence until expiration of said parking period so designated, at which time a change of signal or some other mechanical operation shall indicated expiration of said parking period.

SECTION VIII. The City is hereby vested with the authority to enter into a contract for the purchase and installation or parking meters and to provide payment therefor exclusively from the receipts obtained by the City from their operation and that said means of payment shall be in addition to any other purchasing powers heretofore granted the City by its charter, or by the laws of the State of Kentucky.

SECTION IX. When any vehicle shall be parked next to a parking meter the owner or operator of said vehicle shall park within the area designated by the curb or street marking lines as indicated for parallel or diagonal parking and upon entering said parking space shall immediately deposit in said meter one or more five cent or ten cent coins of the United States and/or one or more one cent coins of the United States as indicated by the instructions on said meter. It shall be unlawful for any person to fail to park within said designated area, or fail or neglect to so deposit the proper coin, or coins.

SECTION X. The said parking space may then be used by such vehicle during the legal parking limit provided by the ordinance of the City, and said vehicle shall be considered as unlawfully parked if it remains in said space beyond the legal parking limit as set out on said meter and/or when said parking meter displays a signal showing such illegal parking.

SECTION XI. It shall be unlawful for any person to cause or permit any vehicle registered in his name to be unlawfully parked as set in this section.

SECTION XII. It shall be unlawful for any person to deposit, or cause to be deposited in a parking meter one or more five or ten coins and/or one or more one cent coins for the purpose of extending the parking time beyond the maximum time fixed by the ordinance of the City of Morganfield, Kentucky.

SECTION XIII. It shall be unlawful to deposit or cause to be deposited in any parking meter, any slug, device or metallic substitute for a coin of the United States.

SECTION XIV. It shall be unlawful for any person to tamper with, open, willfully break or destroy any parking meter.

SECTION XV. It shall be the duty of traffic officers so instructed to take the parking meter number and the state vehicle tax number of all persons violating the provisions of this ordinance and make complaint therefor in the City of Morganfield Police Court of the City of Morganfield, Kentucky.

SECTION XVI. Any person who shall violate or assist in violating this ordinance shall upon conviction be fined not more than Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) and costs.

SECTION XVII. The fee required to be deposited in said meter is hereby levied as a police regulation and inspection fee to cover the cost of providing parking spaces, parking meters, and installation and maintenance thereof, and the cost of regulation and inspection, operation, control, and use of the parking meter spaces and zones created herein, for the regulation and control of traffic moving in and out of and parking in, said parking spaces and zones so created and for the cost of any resultant traffic administration expense.

SECTION XVIII. If any section, provision or part thereof in this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional by court of competent jurisdiction, then such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

FREEDOM-TO-WORK RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the right of every individual citizen to earn his or her living by working at any available job or trade for which he or she is qualified is an inherent, essential and fundamental part of our American heritage; and

WHEREAS, such a right should not be limited by or conditioned upon membership in or payments to any group or organization in any manner; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the public policy of Morganfield, Union County Kentucky be that the right of persons to work shall not be denied or abridged on account of membership or non-membership in, or conditioned upon payments to, any labor union, or labor organization, provided that this policy shall not be construed to deny or abridge the right of employees by and through a labor organization or or labor union to bargain collectively with their employer.
